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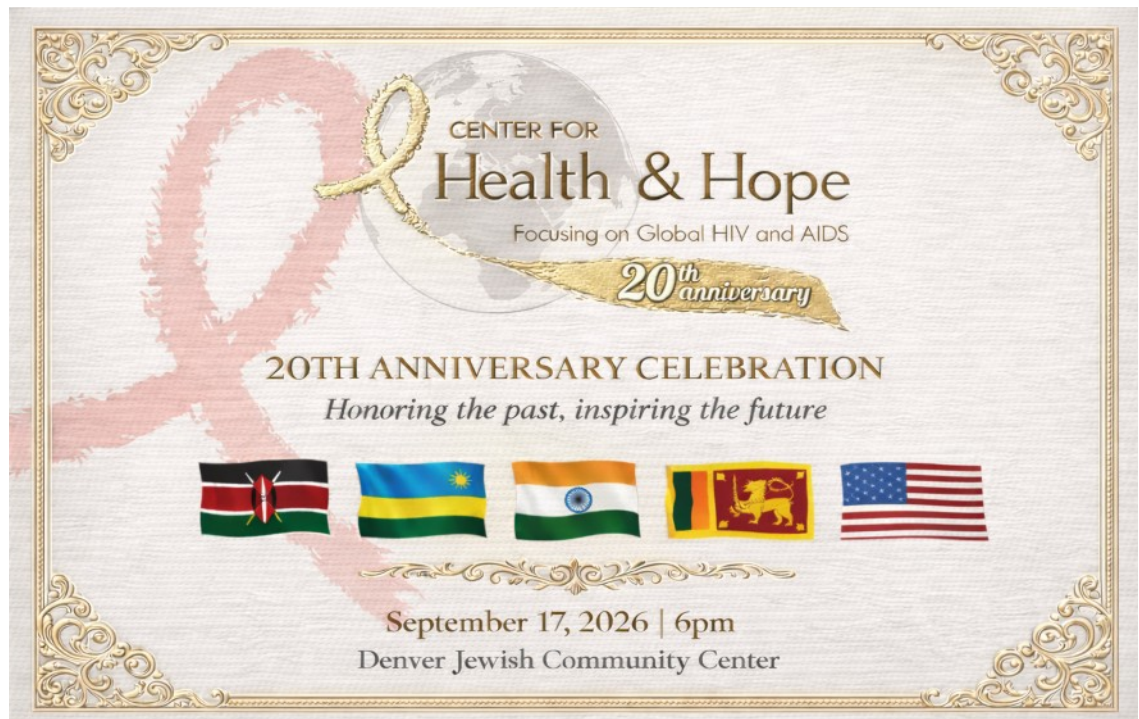
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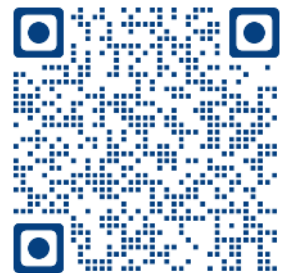

Letter from the Executive Director

The year 2025 marked my first full year as the Center's Executive Director - and what an inspiring year it has been. At a time when global health funding is becoming increasingly scarce, you stepped forward to meet the moment with compassion and generosity.

Because of your help, the Center was able to respond to urgent needs around the world. In Kenya, donors helped sustain the "**Kenya 46**," members of the Meru community who lost critical nutritional assistance when **PEPFAR funding was cut** - many of whom are living with HIV. Along the Congo-Rwanda border, **308** individuals received humanitarian support, including many people impacted by HIV and a military conflict out of their hands. In Kolkata, India, we launched a new People Aging with HIV program, providing care and companionship to **148** individuals. And here in Colorado where the Center is headquartered, the Center was proud to help organize Denver's annual World AIDS Day observance, bringing together dozens of local nonprofits and health care providers in a powerful demonstration of collaboration and hope.

Thanks to your generous support, the Center awarded nearly **\$300,000 in grants** in 2025 - a record amount - to sustain programs both locally and globally. In the pages that follow, you will find stories of impact and recognition of the many individuals who make this work possible. As I often say, this work is truly about people helping people.

Thank you for your partnership in lifting lives. On behalf of the Center's Board of Directors and staff, we are deeply grateful for your compassion, commitment, and care.

Making an Impact

The impact of the Center's programs begins with you. Through the generosity of donors, the dedication of volunteers, and strong partnerships both locally and globally, we are able to provide education, health services, nutrition, and compassionate care to communities affected by HIV and AIDS.

School Nutrition in Byahi Cell, Rwanda

Zahara M. is a single mother raising two children, including her son Obed, who is living with HIV. Through the Center's school nutrition program, **Obed and 319 other children** receive daily meals - an essential foundation for health, especially for children managing HIV.

"When the Center began supporting Obed's school meals, my heart found peace," Zahara shared. "I know that at least during the day, my child eats." Beyond providing nutrition, the Center is working alongside Zahara to strengthen her family's future through a small income-generating project. With your support, we're creating greater stability, dignity, and hope for Zahara, Obed, and their family.



Post-Secondary Scholarships in Kitale, Kenya

Tony Mwiti is a Clinical Medicine and Surgery student at Kenya Medical Training College. Thanks to the generosity of donors like you, he is one of **30 post-secondary students** in Kenya who are able to pursue their educational dreams through the Center's scholarship support. For Tony, this opportunity represents more than a degree—it is a chance to give back.

Confronting Stigma in Mukamira, Rwanda

Fighting stigma and discrimination—and encouraging regular HIV testing and prevention—remains a priority of the Center's work. On World AIDS Day, the community of Mukamira came together for a special observance focused on awareness, support, and hope.

Village leaders and the Mukamira health officer offered words of encouragement, reminding community members that knowledge, compassion, and testing are key to stopping the spread of HIV and supporting those living with the virus. Through gatherings like this, the Center helps create safe spaces for conversation, education, and solidarity—empowering communities to confront stigma and take meaningful steps toward healthier futures.



Vocational Training in Kolkata, India

Puja is one of the students supported by the Center through the Snehakunja Children's Home in India, a program created to support children impacted by HIV and AIDS. Today, **50 children** receive educational support, nutrition, and health care through this initiative.

With encouragement, mentorship, and professional training, Puja has grown into a confident young woman. Once deeply shy, she is now enrolled in Nursing Training School at Imambara District Hospital. Puja approaches her studies and responsibilities with clarity and self-belief, preparing for a future where she can care for others. Her journey reflects how opportunity, guidance, and compassion can transform lives.



Global Connections & Lasting Impact

Each year, the Center offers immersive trips that allow volunteers and supporters to see our programs firsthand and connect with the communities we serve. In 2025, Center volunteers and team members traveled to **Kenya, Rwanda, and India**—experiences that deepen understanding and strengthen relationships. These visits provide meaningful opportunities to meet local leaders like **Glorie Gitonga**, a social worker and the **2025 Meru Human Rights Activist of the Year**, who oversees the Gift of H.O.P.E. program. They also create powerful moments of connection with the children and families whose lives are touched by this work. Through these shared experiences, partnerships grow stronger and our global community becomes even more connected.

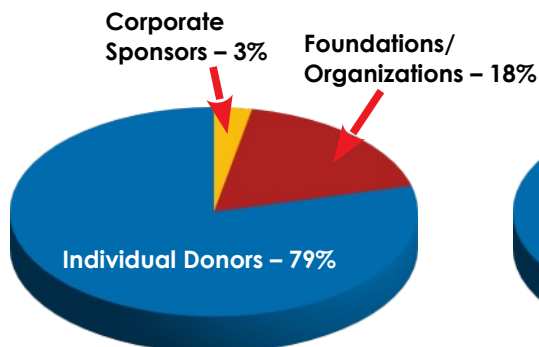

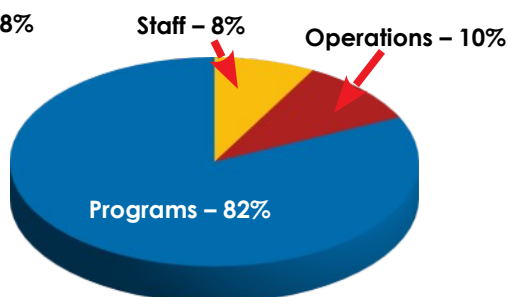
Financials

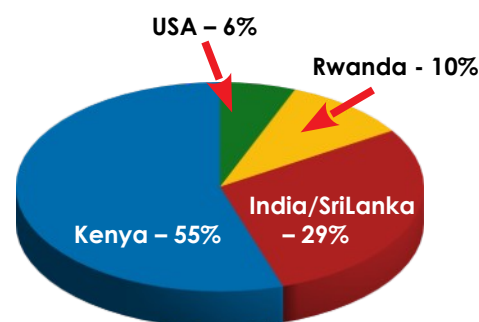
Income: \$ 470,273

In February, a group of 30 Center supporters explored the thought-provoking exhibit at the Boulder Jewish Community Center, followed by a post-tour discussion and conversation with Liz Elsen, *The Center on Colfax's* Director of Education and Training.

Since 2015, the Center and the *Tucson Interfaith HIV/AIDS Network (TIHAN)* have collaborated on a benefit event in Arizona to support both non-profits. The 2025 edition in March raised a record amount for HIV awareness and care programs, while honoring Scott Blades (founder of TIHAN) for his many years of service.



Spring is a Time for H.O.P.E.

The sold-out brunch at the University of Denver in April featured a keynote speech by Carlotta Walls Lanier, a member of the Little Rock Nine, the first Black students to attend Little Rock Central High School in Arkansas. Funds were raised to support 315 children orphaned by AIDS in Meru, Kenya.

The Center hosted two social hours (one in May and September) at LGBTQ+ friendly breweries (Goldspot and Lady Justice) giving Center supporters and those curious to learn more a chance to connect in a casual, after-work environment.



Denver Pride Fest

The Center was proud to share a table with Aurora's *It Takes A Village* at Denver Pride in Civic Center Park, in addition to a presence at Pride on South Pearl Street in Denver.

Over 100 golfers came together in August at Denver's City Park Golf Course to raise funds for the Center's programs in India. Our popular silent auction brought in a record amount, as patrons snapped up Broncos and CO Symphony tickets, dinner certificates, and much more.

A sold-out breakfast at Hope United Methodist Church raised funds for post-secondary scholarships in Kenya. Original Center board member, John Blinn, was honored with the Center's Leadership Award for his many years of dedication to the marginalized and stigmatized.
