DEEP IN KENYA'S RAIN FOREST, FIVE HOMES BUILT FOR FAMILIES LIVING WITH AIDS

Five small two-room houses were built in Maua, Kenya, this summer for very poor families living with AIDS. \$3,000 not only constructs a house but also provides mattresses, bedding, a year's education for the children & health care for the family. Dedicating the dwellings were Kenyans & a team of ten persons from the Denver area who spent two weeks visiting AIDS projects. Donors gave the homes in memory of Richard Moore, Jerome Carter, Polly & Loyd Berger, Paul & Paula Murphy, & Fred Anthony Holland/ Roderick Joseph. Neighbors joined in celebration with singing, dancing & drumming!



"HERO OF THE YEAR" MET HIV PATIENTS WITH OPEN DOORS, NOT SPACESUITS



"Some doctors approached HIV patients in spacesuits for fear of being

infected," remembers Burton Golub, M.D., "but from the beginning my door was always open to caring for patients with a strange new illness known as AIDS." For over 30 years he reached out to hundreds & hundreds of men & women facing the disease in Denver. For the past five years he has traveled as a volunteer to visit AIDS projects in India. In Calcutta & in villages in southern India, Burt



& his wife Lee have started a program teaching English to poor & HIV positive children. "Kids with English skills have a better chance in life." Golub will be honored by the Center Board as its "Hero of the Year" on May 5, 2018, at the University of Denver.

ORPHANED BY AIDS, GLORIE NOW HELPS 260 OTHER OPHANS

Each year Center friends provide \$180 to support an AIDS orphan in Kenya. Glorie Gitonga got this help as a child & later trained as a social worker. Now she has returned to assist other children & youth facing similar dilemmas of dire poverty, hunger, isolation, & depression. Many are tempted to commit suicide. Long's Peak UMC supports her yearly salary of \$3,000.

FEEDING THE HUNGRY & ENHANCING NUTRITION ESSENTIAL TO ENDING HIV & AIDS

Hunger continues to stalk humanity. In slums of Kenya, mothers boil water to fill empty stomachs. Without food, people with HIV quit taking their medicine because pills feel like poison. Therefore, feeding the hungry & enhancing nutrition are key programs for the Center both in Africa and India. Donors are providing education & two meals a day for 188 children in a Nairobi slum, feeding 80 street children who sleep in the garbage pits, as well as providing Kenya famine relief. In India, monthly nutritional supplements are given to 140 families in Chennai & Namakkal. The need outstrips our resources—can you or your church help?

MARCHED IN DENVER & MANILA PRIDE PARADES

HIV still disproportionately impacts gay & bisexual men around the world. LGBTQ persons suffer discrimination & stigma, even persecution, in many places. In response, the Center stipulates all persons receiving grants must pledge to serve all people. This summer the Center sponsored a workshop on "Creating Safe Spaces" in Kenya for LGBTQ citizens & refugees. Representatives also marched in Pride Parades both in Colorado & the Philippines.

Vulnerable women & persons with HIV received 30 sheep and 30 goats in Rwanda from the Center in 2016. They provide valuable milk for families & manure for farming. Seven died from sickness or wild dogs! But new births were given to others, so now there are 43 sheep & 50 goats! More are needed!
