SHEEP & GOATS TRANSFORM LIVES

Overcoming Hunger & Poverty of HIV Positive Persons

Widows and orphans in Rwanda and Kenya suffer from a devastating combination of hunger, poverty, and disease. By distributing sheep and goats to persons living with HIV, the Center for Health and Hope enables people to become more self-supporting, as they gain a resource for nutrition & income. Recently

30 sheep & 31 goats in rural Rwanda, and some 80 goats & sheep in Kenya, were distributed. Recipients agree to give the first born to other vulnerable persons. Donors last year gave a life-giving animal for Christmas. "Looking into the eyes of thankful women, my heart was beating with joy," said Dr. Don Messer, as he reflected on his recent visit to Rwanda. "How I wish every donor could experience the thrill of being a life saver."



PRINCE HARRY & ELTON JOHN DECRY STIGMA

Prince Harry, Duke of Sussex, declared at the International AIDS Conference this summer that "AIDS is a topic that has drifted from the headlines. And with that drift of attention, we



risk a real drift of funding and action to beat the virus. We cannot lose a sense of urgency ..." Choosing to follow in the footsteps of his late mother, Princess Diana, he joined popular singer, Elton John, to express frustration about persistent homophobia & stigma "It is sinful we don't end AIDS," said John, "but bigotry and hatred toward LGBTQ persons holds the world back." Failure to educate, test and treat key population groups like men who have sex with men, injecting drug users, sex workers, prisoners,

and refugees means "20 years from now we will be wondering why HIV still has not been conquered," he said. Together they started MenStar aimed at reaching young men, who globally are most resistant to getting tested & treated.





CELEBRATING A FIVE YEAR ANNIVERSARY

Five years ago the Center rebuilt Hope Mission School in the slums of Nairobi, Kenya, after the dilapidated facility was ordered destroyed. Speakers at the "Gathering to HEAL" breakfast Oct. 20 will celebrate the past five years of educating 188 children & feeding them twice daily. School Director, Anne Baraza, will share stories of sorrow & triumph as she labors with underpaid teachers & a violent

neighborhood. Rev. Dr. Harvey Martz, retired senior pastor of St. Andrew UMC, Highlands Ranch, will receive the Paul & Paula Murphy Human Sexuality Award for helping remove the marginalization that LGBTQ persons experience in most churches. Soloist Chin Keong Tan & Daryl Walker will provide special music. Theresa Marchetta will return as MC. GLOBAL AIDS PANDEMIC: NEARLY OVER OR STILL FLOURISHING?

Measuring whether the HIV & AIDS pandemic is nearly over or still flourishing depends on where you live and whether you see the proverbial glass half-full or half-empty. If you are among the 60 percent of the 37 million people infected in the world who have access to life-saving treatment, your perspective will be different than the 40 percent who face suffering without medicine.

Speakers at the July 22rd International AIDS Conference in Amsterdam, Netherlands, celebrated glowing progress made in recent years in reducing infections & deaths in certain parts of the world. But dramatic disparities exist globally in how HIV and AIDS are experienced. In the USA virtually no babies are born HIV positive; yet 400 children daily enter this world with the virus. Western Europe has reduced infections, but Russia & Eastern Europe have a 30% increase. The Philippines faces a rising infection rate.


"There can be no Brexit against AIDS," declared former U.S. President Bill Clinton as "it would be calamitous to withdraw efforts before victory is achieved. The temptation," he said, "is to think AIDS is over. If we walk backwards, the chance is that AIDS will return in epidemic proportions with breathtaking consequences. The goal remains to save as many lives as possible."

DEADLY COMBINATION: TUBERCULOSIS KILLS 370 THOUSAND PERSONS INFECTED BY HIV

Tuberculosis remains the world's most infectious disease, infecting 10 million and killing 1.7 million persons a year, including 370,000 persons struggling with HIV & AIDS. Some 4,500 people (including 600 children) die daily from TB, because of misdiagnosis and/or lack of a simple medication. At a special session of UNAIDS & the World Council of Churches, Eric Goodsby, Special UN TB Ambassador, asked churches "to educate, motivate, and activate" communities regarding HIV & TB. "People are dying from a disease that is fully curable." Drug-resistant strains of the disease are increasing, however. Few US cases meant the special UN session highlighting TB went unnoticed in the US media.

RWANDA



An HIV positive United Methodist pastor & his wife learned they were infected seven years ago. "I share our story with our congregation," he reports, "and many people come to us for help & counseling because we are open and they trust us." Seven men in his congregation were recently diagnosed with the disease.
