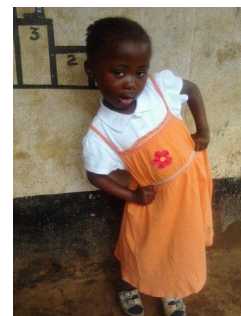

HELP REBUILD A SCHOOL IN THE HEART OF KENYA'S SLUMS



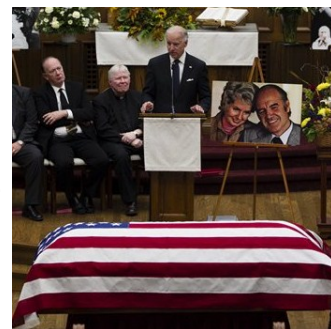
Nearly 150 children await their new school & daily meal.

Poverty, hunger, disease, violence, open sewage, and polluted water surround a new school emerging in the Kibera slums of Nairobi, *Carole Ann* Kenya. If \$25,000 can be raised by Easter, 150 children can go back to school, where they get their only meal of the day. "Four years ago, I blessed a baby whose parents are HIV positive," said Donald Messer, Center Executive Director. "Last summer I met Carole Ann again—she is ready for school now. But where will she study?"



SENATORS BOB DOLE & TOM DASCHLE JOIN CENTER BOARD AFTER DEATH OF GEORGE MCGOVERN

Two prominent Americans, former Majority Leaders of the United States Senate, Bob Dole (R-Kansas) and Tom Daschle (D-S.D), agreed to become co-chairs of the Center's International Advisory Board, following the death of the founding honorary chair, Sen. George McGovern. Vice President Joe Biden hailed McGovern as a patriot who fought AIDS, world hunger & stopped the Vietnam war. Daschle eulogized McGovern as a "humanitarian & a voice for the voiceless." Dole said "America and the world are for the better because of him."

WORLD LEADER SPEAKS AT BRUNCH TO BENEFIT ORPHANS



South African AIDS activist and the executive leader of the World Methodist Council, Bishop Ivan M. Abrahams will keynote the 2013 "*Spring Is A Time For HOPE*" Brunch on April 13 at the University of Denver. Funds raised support over 200 AIDS orphans in Kenya. A gift of \$150 qualifies for two brunch tickets, thanks to a donor. HOPE stand for "*Helping Orphans by Providing Essentials*." Abrahams has described the AIDS pandemic in Africa as a "genocide of indifference" by church & society.

GEORGE MCGOVERN: ENDING HUNGER AND AIDS

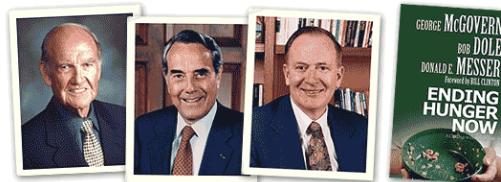


(Celebrating George McGovern's 90th birthday with Statue of Liberty birthday cake in background, July, 2012.)

I deeply grieve the passing of a great humanitarian, statesman and long-time personal friend, former United States senator and 1972 Democratic presidential candidate, George S. McGovern. He was awarded America's highest honor, the Medal of Freedom, by President Bill Clinton. Right up until he entered hospice care and died peacefully, McGovern seemed to triumph over aging and to defy death. Most nonagenarians prefer a slower pace, but at age 90, he continued writing books and traveling the country delivering speeches.

McGovern's deepest personal and political passions were to end war, eliminate hunger, and end AIDS. In 2005, it was my unique privilege to co-author the book, "Ending Hunger Now: A Challenge to Persons of Faith" with former Senators Bob Dole & George McGovern. Even as his body became frail, McGovern's mind was still alert and active. In a visit just two weeks before his death, he expressed to me his appreciation and encouragement for the work we were doing together on issues of world hunger and global AIDS through the Dakota Wesleyan University McGovern Center.

McGovern faced death without fear. He often recalled an audience with Pope John XXIII, recounting with quiet satisfaction how the Pope grasped his hand and said, "Mr. McGovern, when you go to meet your Maker and he asks, 'Did you feed the hungry?' You can say, 'I did.'"

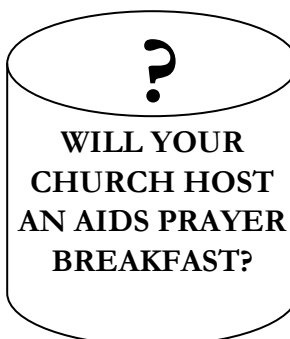


SUCCESSFUL MATCH OF \$15,000 CHALLENGE

December 2012 proved to be a record fund-raising month for the Center for the Church and Global AIDS. Participating for the first time in Colorado Gives Day, friends of the Center successfully matched a \$15,000 challenge grant in just 24 hours. One-third of the gifts came from 16 states other than Colorado. Over \$50,000 was raised in December for AIDS programs around the world.

1,168 PERSONS PROVIDED MEDICAL AND DENTAL CARE IN KENYA

Thanks to gifts of \$2,500 raised at an AIDS Prayer Breakfast at St. Andrew United Methodist, Highlands Ranch, CO, 1,168 poor persons in rural Kenya received free medical and dental care. "Amazing what \$2 can do to save a life," remarked Rev. Kent Millard, the Prayer Breakfast preacher. "If only other churches would combine prayer and care, imagine what could happen?"

AIDS tends to be overlooked in India, despite having 2,500,000 persons infected—the third largest in the

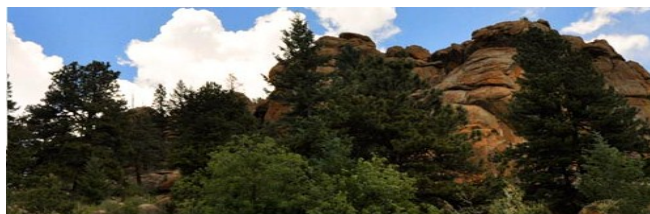


world. Why? Because it is a small percentage of India's one billion population, and the fact that most infected come from lower, neglected, impoverished castes. In March six persons from Colorado visited the AIDS programs funded by the Center in Chennai and rural Namakkal. Time was spent at the homes of child-headed households, visiting HIV clinics for women & children, and speaking at university seminars.

INTEGRATED PREVENTION: DISTRIBUTE CONDOMS, MALARIA NETS & WATER FILTERS

For just \$25, families can be helped to combat malaria, HIV, and unclean water. In a new program being pioneered by the Center in rural Kenya, the Center will partner with the church and community organizations in distributing malaria nets, condoms, and family water filters. A volunteer team led by Bill Graf and Chad Roope hope to raise sufficient funds to help up to 2,500 families. Needed are individuals, churches, Rotary Clubs, and others committed to ending the scourge of widespread diarrhea, malaria, and HIV. Bishop Catherine Mutua of Meru,

Kenya, says "such an integrated approach has long been needed to help prevent infections and promote health." Research in Zambia showed that giving HIV-positive mothers water purifiers reduced deadly diarrhea in children and adults by **53%**.
